



Superintendent's Report

Ability to Offer Local Events

For most, being able to attend locally sponsored face-to-face events is considered one of the major reasons for being a member of the National Model Railroading Association (NMRA). To that end, the Los Angeles (L.A.) Division attempts to hold (or sponsor) at least one such event each quarter of the year. We're talking about: SpringRail, FallRail, L.A. Area Prototype Modelers' Meet, Freight Fright/Frosty Fright Modular Layouts Invitational Meet, or Annual Membership Meeting and [subsidized] Banquet.

Each event attracts dozens-to-hundreds of people annually. But our ability to continue putting them on is becoming harder and harder to accomplish for a single reason – **the Division is running out of volunteer manpower.**

Causes for this loss is multi-fold: members who chose/had to quit the NMRA during the now receding pandemic, individuals physically moving out of the Division or Region, existing volunteers becoming "burned-out" due to overload, etc... You get the idea.

When I first moved back to the L.A. Division five years ago, I discovered there were a dozen or more individuals who would constantly respond to requests for help. Today, that number is roughly five (5). If it gets much lower, we, as a Division, will cease to function effectively.

If you care about the quality of programs and services your Division delivers, it is time to step up or accept the consequences.

Elsewhere in the pages of this issue, you'll find positions needing volunteers. Minimal tasks that truly help your Division to continue providing the services and events you've come to expect and enjoy. Pick the one that's special to you; then contact me. We'll discuss how a bit of your time and energy will make a big difference.

As always, I welcome your thoughts or comments.

Until our next *LA Coupler* comes out, happy model railroading to you.

Mini-Modules

Modular model railroad clubs have been around for many decades. They're a handy way to build a section at home then set it up with others at weekend train shows to make really big layouts. Typically, regular modules for HO scale are 4' long and 24" to 36" wide.

Several things have changed in the past few years: two- and three-day train shows are few and far between; hobbyists have more difficulty in committing to a multi-day event;

many are driving smaller vehicles and some may be living in smaller places.

One solution to this might be mini-modules. My module club, the '20s, '30s and Beyond Model Railroad has been operating 6' x 30" modules since 1991 and now we're introducing mini-modules that are only 3' x 18". The minis are essentially dioramas that can connect to other minis or standard club modules.



These make it really easy to participate in one-day events, especially at venues that have limited space. The minis are intended to be set up in a line for point-to-point operations.

However, one member has built a pair of return loops — each on a pair of 3' x 3' modules. The curves have tight radii, only 15", so that means they're for switch engines and 37' or shorter cars..

Still, even with the loops it's a straight line display which is important because we can set up at venues that may only have a 5' x 25' space available. Even better, the mini-modules can be set up quickly since we won't need to deal with corners, a yard and a walk-through gate. This makes being at one-day events possible. A bonus is that some are by non-model groups such as historical societies and civic organizations that may be a way of our introducing new people to the hobby.

New members are welcome to join the '20s, '30s and Beyond Model Railroad club. There is no formal application process or cost. Just help out at setups or also build a mini- or regular module that is of similar quality to the ones already made. There are no dues, no officers, no bylaws and no meetings. Despite the name, active members are not modeling before the mid-1930s and the "beyond" extends to a vague time in the late 1940s or even the early 1950s. 



Here are the basic dimensions for the items that go on top of the frame. The two-inch thick foam permits carving scenic shapes below track level, if desired, without compromising the frame strength. All trackwork must be DCC compatible.

The frame and legs assemble quickly with bolts and wingnuts. They can be homemade or purchased from companies that make them to order. For a setup with only a few mini-modules they could be set on tables instead of using legs.



A 3' x 1 1/2' mini-module is large enough to build a scene, yet small enough to store and transport easily. Connect it to others for an operating session at small public shows. Only two tracks are required and they can run the long way like this one, or the short way.

If you're short on space, a mini-module can fit on top of a file cabinet. A 5/8" thick piece of plywood was attached to the cabinet with self-adhesive Velcro and has quarter-round molding on three sides to keep the mini-module from sliding off. A piece of gray foam pipe insulation guards against head bumps when using the drawers.



Foam putty works well to square up sides and smooth rough areas. When dry it carves just like rigid foam.

Director's Report

During the weekend of April 21, 2022, the Pacific Southwest Region's (PSR) Board of Directors held their mid-year meeting. Because of the vast area our Region covers, it was held interactively via the Zoom app. Here are some of the main topics presented at the meeting:

State of the Region: To quote our PSR President, Pat Raymer, "I am pleased to report that the PSR is in good shape, both fiscally and in membership numbers. ...we have had noticeable uptick in membership [and] while we are not quite at the same numbers in 2020, the trend is in the right direction." It also was expressed the value of in-person events cannot be overstated.

501(c)(3) Non-Profit Status: The Region has completed its conversion to a fully functional 501(c)(3) recognized organization. While a bit more "fine tuning" may occur between the Region and its Divisions, for example, assisting Divisions with updating their operating By-Laws, things appear to be running smoothly. A reminder: when requesting division-level donations, for fund raising or operational purposed, don't forget to mention our non-profit status. It may encourage donations that otherwise might not occur or reveal undisclosed discounts.

2024 NMRA National Convention and National Train Show: It was announced the PSR has been awarded the bid for the 2024 NMRA National Convention and National Train Show. While negotiations between the NMRA's Meetings and Trade Shows Department and the PSR remain on-going, venue locales of either Long Beach, CA or Pasadena, CA are being considered. Due the size and scope of this project, the support and effort of the entire PSR will be required. More details hopefully to be released soon.

Upcoming Regional Conventions: Status reports were presented by the San Diego and Arizona Divisions. San Diego is hosting the PSR's 2022 Convention, "Back on Track in 2022", September 7th – 11th. Among details shared were that there will be 3 clinic rooms; one equipped to handle incoming Zoom-based clinicians from Australia, Europe, Canada, and the USA. Visit www.PSRConvention.org for more details.

Arizona will host the PSR's 2023 Convention in Flagstaff, AZ, June 7th-10th. Contracts for hotel and adjacent convention center venues have been signed and deposits paid. Of special interest is the convention team's desire to include of a train trip (possibly stream powered) to the Grand Canyon on the Grand Canyon Railway.

Being more than a year out however and many items still in their early planning stages, specifics won't be available until later this year.

PSR Officers Election: An outreach for candidates, followed by an election for the positions of **Region President** and **Region Vice President** will occur this year. Nominations will be accepted starting in June 2022; with an election being held in August, 2022.

New PSR Board Members: It was announced during the mid-year meeting **Mike Allee** (Cajon) will be taking over the duties of PSR Contest Chair, as well as overseeing the newly created Region's Education Program. Past PSR President **Don Fowler** (San Diego) was introduced as the Region's new Parliamentarian. Each appointment became effective immediately.

Request for *PSR Dispatch* Material: Editor Kevin Spady shared with the Board that he is always on the lookout for stories, photos, even "leads" for publication in the Region's PSR Dispatch newsletter. 



Make Models of Models

Foam-core mock-ups help to visualize a scene, and finalize structure dimensions and placement. The foam-core board is 1/4" thick. When joined together, walls are self supporting. This allows the structures to be easily moved around as plans change. Hot glue works well to hold the walls together, as do T-pins.



The sugar beet refinery, as viewed from the back.

When built in 1893, the Spreckels Sugar Beet Refinery was the largest beet factory in the world. Shrinking the main building to N scale gives you a structure approximately 8" wide, 44" deep, and 10" high. I couldn't fit the entire depth on my layout, so my model will be about 24" deep. I was able to maintain scale width and height on all except for the warehouse that runs parallel to the tracks (to the left in the image above).

A structure this size will define this part of my layout. It will also take a while to build. Rather than leave the space blank for who-knows-how-long, I decided to build a quick mock-up of the complex out of foam-core poster board. This allows me to get a feel for the final scene, finalize the size of the structures before buying the final materials, and gives trains a place to go while operating the layout.

Some purchases, such as those made through a Kindle store, Amazon physical stores, or Alexa-enabled devices are not eligible for any donation and the donations made by Amazon are not tax deductible by you as the donations are made by Amazon. One nice feature is that if you are currently purchasing from Amazon, your account is the same for AmazonSmile as well. Your shopping cart, wish list, registries and other account settings are identical, and all this doesn’t cost you a nickel!

How Does the Pacific Southwest Region benefit?

Each quarter the PSR NMRA will receive an electronic funds transfer from Amazon for the total of the donations during the prior period. I personally do quite a bit of shopping online and I just recently switched my contribution over to the PSR NMRA once we achieved our 501 c (3) designation. Last year my contributions totaled over \$20.00. If just half of our regional membership contributed at that level, we would be contributing over \$10,000 annually to the PSR. Imagine what could be done with that amount of funding to give back quality content, events, and benefits to our membership!

Come join us at the 2022 Pacific Southwest Region Model Railroad Convention in beautiful San Diego, California!

The convention will be hosted by the San Diego Division of the National Model Railroad Association on Sept. 7th to 11th, 2022.

The opening event of the convention will be at the famous San Diego Model Railroad Museum, Located in Balboa Park. We will have a presentation there and refreshments.



Layout Tours: The San Diego area has some excellent layouts to visit. Descriptions and pictures of the layouts offered for touring are available at the convention website: psrconvention.org/BackOnTrack2022

There will also be operations sessions held at many of the layouts which will give you an opportunity to run trains under the guidance of expert model railroaders.



Prototype Tours: One of the feature prototype tours will be at the Pasha car loading facility which is the largest on the west coast. We will also have tours of the Pacific Southwest Railway Museum in Campo, California, the BNSF Railroad Yard, the San Diego Trolley Yard and Maintenance Facility, The Poway Midland Railroad (and more).
